EASTON — The Federal Lab Consortium for Technology Transfer Mid-Atlantic Region will be hosting the Eastern Shore Federal Laboratory Consortium Conference on March 12 at Krystal Q Conference Center.

The conference is an opportunity for technology-based businesses, economic development partners and universities and colleges to network with representatives from many of the Mid Atlantic's federal laboratories. Attendees will learn about opportunities to transfer cutting edge technologies for private sector business growth and development and to bring technologies of interest to the federal laboratories.

The Federal Laboratory Consortium for Technology Transfer is the nationwide network of federal laboratories that provides the forum to develop strategies and opportunities for linking the laboratory mission technologies and expertise with the marketplace. The mission of the consortium is to add value to the federal agencies, laboratories and their partners to accomplish the rapid integration of research and development resources within the mainstream of the U.S. economy.

The Mid-Atlantic region of the consortium comprises more than 70 federal laboratories and agencies. The region focuses on the federal research and development assets located in Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia.
